

The funeral of Mrs. Wm. Reddick took place on Sunday last from her late residence. It was probably the largest ever seen in Ottawa, testifying the great regard in which the deceased was held by all classes of our people. The casket was literally buried in flowers, gifts of sorrowing friends, some of them of exquisite design and beauty. The house and grounds were filled with friends, more than a thousand people being present. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Mr. Young, just as she herself had directed before her death. Rev. M. K. Whittlesey also took part in the services. The pall bearers were Hon. G. W. Armstrong, Sheriff Milligan, J. G. Nattinger, E. Y. Griggs, J. F. Nash, H. W. S. Rigden, W. W. Harden and J. A. Shuler. An unusually long procession of carriages followed the body to the cemetery, where some 500 people had gathered to witness the last sad rites.
