So what is behind that Wainscoting Anyway?

Since the Reddick Mansion Association took over the Mansion from the Library and restoration took place, there has always been a question of what was behind the wainscoting on the entrance west wall and also up the staircase.

Along the east wall of the second floor hallway ran the beautiful faux bois (fake wood) painting that was under glass. Could this also be on the west side and up the staircase?

Recently, as part of the Historical Survey, the glass was taken off the faux bois painting. See the picture below. The painting was preserved under the glass and is wonderfully vibrant.



As the Historical Survey progressed, it was decided to investigate what was under the wainscoting. The small area in the second floor entrance behind the clock was chosen since it could be covered up easily if something did not materialize. Much to everyone's delight, it was discovered that indeed the faux bois painting matching the east wall was also on this wall. See the picture to the right below. The future of the old

wainscoting will depend on the outcome of the Historical Survey. If deemed appropriate, it will take some time, effort and expense to restore the original painting. Look for updates on the possibilities for the future. Meanwhile, stop by the Mansion to see the newly exposed panel.



On Thursday, May 9, the Mansion received a visit from Thomas Jeffris, the president of the Jeffris Foundation of Janesville, Wisconsin that is splitting the cost of the historic structure report. He was met at the Mansion by Ottawa Mayor Robert Eschbach, mansion advocate Edmund Thorntorn and Diane Sanders, president of the Reddick Mansion Association. The foundation's future financial support will depend in part on the outcome of the structure report that is being conducted by Anna Sullivan of Sullivan Preservation in Chicago. The report is anticipated to be completed in the end of July. During his visit, Mr. Jeffris was very impressed by the Mansion.
